# What is an essay?

#### An essay:

- responds to an essay question
- is a **formal** piece of writing
- has an **organised structure** with an **introduction**, a **body** with paragraphs, and a **conclusion**
- expresses an opinion, and
- uses evidence to support ideas.

# **Starting Your Essay**

- 1. Read the question.
- 2. List the important words from the question:

3. Brainstorm the words from the question:

**HOW** does the protagonist change and develop?

**WHY** must the protagonist change and develop?

What type of **CHANGE** takes place in Phillip?

How has Phillip **DEVELOPED** by the end of the novel?

# **My Introduction**

Summarise your understanding of how and why Phillip changes and develops. This is also called your 'thesis' and expresses your main ideas in relation to the question.

### **Essay Structure**

Structure your essay in the most effective way to communicate your ideas and answer the question. All essays should include the following structure:

#### 1. Introduction

Answer the question and provide a summary or 'road map' of your essay. Tell the reader what you are going to talk about and what you believe the answer to be. Keep it brief, but mention all your main ideas.

#### 2. Body

The body of your essay is where you answer the question by developing a discussion. Here, you show your knowledge and grasp of the material you have read. Explain your ideas and give evidence. Use relevant examples and authoritative quotes to support your argument.

#### 3. Conclusion

The conclusion rounds off the essay. Relate it back to your main ideas or points and restate your answer to the question. NEVER introduce new information in your conclusion. The conclusion moves from specific to general.

## **Essay Paragraphs: MESL**

Make the point

Explain the point

Support the point (evidence, quotes)

Link the point back to the question (keep it relevant)

Each paragraph in the body of the essay should contain:

- A topic sentence (or main idea sentence) that states your point.
- An explanation of the point you're making.
- Evidence from your reading in the form of quotations.
